Mampando health project progresion

In 2013 Health Australia & Tanzania (HAT) started the Mampando hygiene & sanitation project in partnership with HAPA (Health Action Promotion Association) in Ikungi District at Mampando village, Tanzania.

The project aims to improve the wellbeing of communities through the reduction of diseases associated to poor hygiene and sanitation and also to build capacity to ensure that the community adopts better hygiene practices.

Since the implementation of the project the following achievements have been obtained so far:

-The construction of a sanitation centre (with latrines and sanitation facilities) is in progress.

- -Community animators and artisans have been trained in hygiene & sanitation education and the construction of the sanitation centre so they are able to create awareness activities at community levels.
- -Hygiene and sanitation knowledge and skills have increased in the village.

This is an exciting project because it provides education and technical skills to villagers so that they may construct their own safe toilet at the household level. All the planned activities for this period have been completed and well implemented to achieve the project goals and HAT has just transferred the next payment (\$3,943), leaving just two more payments until the completion of the project.
